## Meeting of Chief Executive Officers of State Waqf Boards at Delhi on April 16, 2015



A full-day Meeting of Chief Executive Officers (CEOs) of State/UT Waqf Boards (SWBs) chaired by Dr. Arvind Mayaram, Secretary to the Government of India (Minority Affairs) was held at New Delhi on Thursday, April 16, 2015 to discuss the following agenda:

- Review of the implementation of the Waqf (Amendments) Act, 2013.
- Review of the progress of Computerization of records of State Waqf Boards and its future strategies.
- Review of the progress of Strengthening of State Waqf Boards.
- Identification and Development of Potential Waqf Boards.
- Review of the performance of the State Waqf Boards.
- Any other item with the permission of the Chair.

Dr. Arvind Mayaram in his opening remarks emphasized that there is no differentiation on the part of the Government for any person on the basis of his/her religion or cast or creed and striving very hard to help each & every one to take along on-board for the Educational & Economical development. He elaborated his point by citing a day-to-day example that how a “class” makes a difference rather than “religion” in the Social Interaction between the citizens. Therefore, to remove the backwardness in the Community, he opined that Waqf Assets must be utilized to their maximum potentials, to bring the Community in the respectable & economical upward “classes” of the Society.

Further, he informed the audience that many people do not aware that Mughal Emperor Aurangzeb donated huge estates for use as Temple sites and support thereof, in Benaras, Kashmir and elsewhere. The official documentations for these land grants are still exist. A stone inscription in the historic Balaji or Vishnu Temple, located north of Chitrakut Balaghat, still shows that it was commissioned by the Emperor himself. The proof of Aurangzeb's land grant for famous Hindu religious sites in Kashi, Varanasi can easily be verified from the deed records extant at those sites. But Waqf concept is very unique in the Muslim Community where peoples dedicate their properties in the name of Almighty God for society welfare purposes, which is commendable and praise worthy.

He urged the Chief Executive Officers to:

- Just Report the number of cases of Encroachment on Waqf Properties to CWC & WAMSI On-line System every month. Ministry of Minority Affairs in consultation with CWC, will take-up the individual cases at appropriate levels.
- Utilize the modern GPS Technologies for mapping of Immovable Waqf Properties over Satellite Imageries under the Government of India - Strengthening of SWBs Scheme. Make best use of GIS enabled integrated WAMSI On-line System, developed & maintained under the Government of India – SWBs Records Computerization Scheme, to input the GPS Coordinates of all the immovable Waqf Properties in your State in the next 6 months.
- Take a share in NAWADCO as equity. Once owned, SWBs involvement will be much more in running it professionally and achieve its objectives for which it was established.

Finally, he suggested to hold an exclusive conference of CEO SWBs at the earliest by CWC to formulate a Model Guidelines to be implemented in next 3-4 months, for utilization of Waqf Income in the Accounting Heads like Establishment, Administration, etc with reasonable limits, so that later-on nobody could misuse the Waqf Income for the purposes other than Specific Intention of Waqf or General Welfare Intention in case no mention of Intention is there in the Waqf. He categorically mentioned that efforts should be made in establishing the Minority Educational Institutions, particularly Technical, Engineering and Medical Institutions, where automatic 50% reservation in admission for the community, will be available as per the laws governing the Minority Institutions.
